
REMESO Book Launch March 12

Handbook on Migration and Development: A Counter-Hegemonic Perspective

Branka Likic-Brboric, Aleksandra Ålund, Carl Ulrik-Schierup and Måns Fellesson present their contributions to the volume Handbook on Migration and Development (Edward Elgar). The book presents a comprehensive overview of migration and development from a range of counter-hegemonic perspectives. Its 28 chapters, by 44 researchers, explore the strengths and weaknesses of existing practices connected with processes of global governance, and raise questions about the role and impact of transnational movements struggling for the human rights of migrants.

Decided Return Migration: Emotions, Citizenship, Home and Belonging in Bosnia and Herzegovina

Aida Ibricevic discusses her book <u>Decided Return Migration</u>, published open access with Springer/IMISCOE. Her study links political emotions, citizenship, home, and belonging. In the case of decided return to a post-conflict society, like Bosnia and Herzegovina, the returnees do not conceptualize their BiH citizenship as "home" and "belonging" as it does not make them feel safe and secure. Instead, "feeling at home" is found in family, place, and time, while belonging" is categorized as ethnic, religious, relational, landscape, linguistic, and economic.
